Saratoga Springs Democratic Committee selects candidate for Commissioner of Public Works Special Election

SARATOGA SPRINGS — On Thursday, June 30, the Saratoga Springs Democratic Committee nominated Jason Golub as their candidate for the upcoming November election. He was selected unanimously by the Recruiting sub-committee and voted on by the entire committee. Jason has been serving as the acting Commissioner of Public Works since being appointed to the role by the City Council after the passing of Anthony (“Skip”) Scirocco.

“I am pleased to represent the city of Saratoga Springs and the Democratic Party in the upcoming DPW election,” said Golub. My campaign is built around three ideas: Service, Vision, and Impact. Service to the community above all else, a vision for the future of DPW that includes clean energy, building a connected city, creating more parks and solving the homeless problem in our city. And finally impact, which is ensuring that DPW has a leader with the experience needed to implement a forward-looking vision. I believe that my professional experience and what I’ve already done as DPW commissioner show that I tick all the boxes.”

“Jason is a leader, plain and simple” said Democratic party chair Pat Tuz. “In less than three months he has proven not only capable of running DPW, but transforming its vision and path forward. He is building new parks, started a recycling program in city buildings, and is looking at ways DPW can tackle the homeless problem. He is a communicator who works well with everyone, regardless of party. We believe that he is simply the best person for the job and I believe the voters will agree.”

Golub is a lawyer, compliance and business leader, having worked in senior roles at General Electric and other large companies with complex organizational structures. He also served as the co-chair of the Saratoga Springs Police Reform Task Force.

The special election will take place on November 8, coinciding with the general election on that date.
